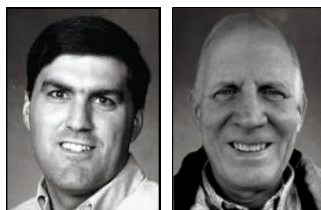
### Program Update

#### SIC Update

#### Training Program Update

The 2014 spring training schedule is included in this newsletter. Please note that Professional Timber Harvesting Essentials will no longer be eligible for continuing education (CE) credits. Game of Logging - Level 1 is still eligible for CE credit as long as you have not taken it within the last 5 years. Also note that registration fees for all Game of Logging - Level 1 courses being offered through the PA SFI program this year will be **FULLY REIMBURSED** after you complete the training. This reimbursement is made possible through a sponsorship grant provided by the Pennsylvania Hardwood Development Council. If you are thinking about getting your PA SFI Training Card, the time to do it is now. Payment must be made before the training date and individuals that register but fail to attend the training will not be refunded.

This unique grassroots network involves private landowners, loggers, forestry professionals, local government agencies, academics, scientists, and conservationists. The Pennsylvania SIC was established in 1995 to promote the SFI forest standard as a means to broaden the practice of responsible forestry in Pennsylvania and achieve on-the-ground progress.

These resources focus on safety, logging regulations, and other important resource and industry information. The **Training Requirements** section details the PA SFI Professional Timber Harvester Training Program and how to obtain and maintain a PA SFI training card. Training participants can now review, register, and pay for PA SFI training under the new **PA SFI Training Courses** section. Participants can also **Request Training** in their area using the new online training request form. ## New Transportation Law Helps Forest Product Haulers

The comprehensive transportation package signed into law by Governor Corbett last November will provide welcome relief to the forest products industry. The law will eventually provide an additional \$2.3 billion annually for transportation infrastructure improvements across the state. But the law also includes expanded relief for haulers of forest products and other haulers impacted by the recent weight posting on rural state routes.

Provisions in the new law include:

- Expansion of PennDOT's existing Letters of Local Determination (LoLD) program, making these Letters available to 'at-risk industries', such as forest products, for any posted state routes (Previously only available on posted state routes that were under bond by a Marcellus drilling operation). These LoLD are free and will allow use of a posted route without requirement of a bond or excess maintenance. The new law extends the effective date of the Letter of LoLD Program until 12/31/2018.
- Allow for creation of a minimum use permit for use by posting authorities for hauling on a route at 700 loads per year or less, expressed as a loads-per-day, loads-per-week or loads-per-month number. This minimum use permit will not require bond or excess maintenance agreement.
- Allow for creation of de minimus use permits for use by posting authorities for hauling that is judged to not have an impact on the posted road, but will likely be for even fewer trips than the minimum use permit. This permit will also not require bond or excess maintenance agreement.
- PennDOT will have the discretion to limit access to these letters and permits based on structural capacity of roads. PennDOT may also limit the use of these Letters and permits during spring thaw.

PennDOT is expected to announce the details and availability of these Letters and permits by late February, although it is anticipated they will be available on posted state routes after this year's spring thaw. Local governments will have the option to provide minimum use and de minimus use permits, but this option won't be available until regulations have been promulgated by PennDOT.

The new law clarifies that exemptions for local delivery or pickup may not include traffic going to or coming from a site at which minerals, natural gas or natural resources are developed, harvested or extracted, even if these activities are occurring at a residence, a commercial site or on farmland. However, delivery or pickup of logs or other forest products to or from permanent processing mills located on or reachable only through posted highways shall continue to be considered local delivery or pickup.

The law allows PennDOT to require multiple vehicles traveling to or from a single destination to operate under a single permit.

The new funding in the law will help the state to address and reverse the deterioration of nearly 10,000 miles of state roadway in 'poor' condition and 4,400 structurally-deficient state bridges. This includes an additional \$1.3 billion annually for state roads and bridges; \$237 million more annually for local roads and bridges; \$12 million more annually for county and forestry roads; and \$35 million annually for the dirt and gravel road program.

PennDOT states that recent posting of weight restrictions on state bridges will be lifted as the rehabilitation of these bridges are programmed into the PennDOT construction schedule, which normally occurs about two years prior to the start of construction. PennDOT estimates that it will be able to rehabilitate about 500 structurally deficient bridges within three years, as opposed to the ten years it would have taken without the additional funding.

PFFPA worked with its legislative allies and PennDOT to get the road bonding relief provisions in the new transportation law.

**SFI Inc. Seeks Comments on  
 Draft 2015-2019 Standard**

The Sustainable Forestry Initiative® is seeking comments on its draft SFI 2015-2019 Standard, during the Standard development process's second 60-day comment period, set to conclude March 6, 2014.

The draft Standard includes new performance measures to conserve biodiversity in fiber sourcing; to limit conversion from one type of forest to another; and to expand the definition of "controversial sources" excluded in SFI-labeled products. The SFI 2015-2019 Standard also outlines the basic requirements for SIC administered logger training programs.

### 2014 COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

#### CORE TRAINING:

Required to receive a PA SFI® Training Card. All 3 requirements must be completed within 2 years in order to receive a PA SFI® Training Card.

- **Professional Timber Harvesting Essentials (8 hours)** – Part one focuses on recognizing and negating hazards that timber harvesting operations encounter daily. It includes modules covering equipment safety, truck safety and an overview of OSHA regulations applicable to logging. Part 2 focuses on the Erosion & Sediment Pollution Control Plan required by Chapter 102, understanding Pennsylvania’s Clean Streams Laws, permits a logger may need when working near streams and wetlands, Best Management Practices (BMPs), and the importance of harvesting aesthetics, job layout, and planning.
- **Game of Logging – Level 1 (8 hours)** - focuses on introducing the participant to the “open face” felling technique and the development of skills to safely use it. Topics covered include personal protective equipment, chainsaw safety features, chainsaw reactive forces, bore cutting, pre-planning the fell, and understanding hinge wood strength.
- **First Aid & CPR (4 hours)** - The focus of this program is on First Aid and Adult CPR training that meets OSHA Logging requirements and American Red Cross (or equivalent) certification. Training can also be taken locally through your Fire Department, EMS, Hospital, etc. Online courses are not accepted by PA SFI.

#### CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE):

**One (1) year of CE credit is given for each four (4) hours of training. CE credit awarded (Training Card Expiration Date) is limited to three (3) years from current calendar year. CE credit will not be awarded for taking the same class more than once in a five (5) year period.**

- **Business Management for Timber Harvesters (8 hours)** - Profitability of timber harvesting businesses is key to implementing sustainable management practices. Participants are introduced to the preparation of business plans, documents used for financial analysis, key people, sources of assistance, employee management, and other components of running a successful business. Exercises include some skills needed to build a business plan, and complete a balance sheet, an enterprise budget, and a production plan.
- **Pennsylvania Wildlife (8 hours)** - a comprehensive four hour course on common wild birds and mammals found in Pennsylvania with a specific emphasis on the habitat needs of white-tailed deer, black bears and wild turkeys. Included will be segments on identifying wildlife foods, tracks, other sign and calls. The legacy of Pennsylvania's premier wildlife artist, the late Ned Smith, will also be covered.
- **Game of Logging (8 hours, each Level)** - These courses cover chainsaw safety and safe/efficient harvesting techniques. **Level 1** (see description under Core Training section). **Level 2** focuses on saw maintenance, chain sharpening techniques, releasing spring poles safely, and directional tree felling.
- **Bats and Timber Management (4 hours)** - Bats have been a hot topic in forest management lately, but why? What is this white nose syndrome all about? Learn about Pennsylvania bat species, their habitat requirements, and regulations that protect certain ones. Find out how white nose syndrome is destroying bat populations and what loggers can do to help.
- **Pennsylvania Timber Rattlesnakes (4 hours)** - Chances are if you have spent any time in Penns Woods you have come across a Timber Rattlesnake. Most loggers probably wish they never saw another Timber Rattlesnake in their life, but actually, this snake needs the help of Pennsylvania's logging workforce in order to stay off the endangered species list. Habitat destruction as well as poaching threatens the future of Pennsylvania's Timber Rattlesnake Population. Find out what you can do to help.
